This year, there are more than 100 participants from 18 partner institutions from seven countries (Indonesia, China, France, Japan, Malaysia, South Korea, and Thailand), with over 100 artworks being exhibited overall. It includes nine local institutions from seven provinces in Indonesia (West Java, Banten, Special Region Yogyakarta, Special Capital Region Jakarta, Central Java, East Java, and Bali). Besides lecturers' artworks, we included some chosen students' artworks from Silpakorn University and Universitas Kristen Maranatha that are performed or presented during Uno Flatu.

Hopefully, the 7th Uno Flatu can give much insight, especially for the art, design, and architecture lecturers, so we can collaborate more to make a better and more sustainable life with our students and society.

CURATORIAL Breathing Again for Sustainability

Academia as an institution plays a crucial role in determining the growth and development of knowledge and its impact on cultural progress, accompanied by systematic patterns resulting from research within a specific context or discipline. Academics are part of a communal society capable of shaping the development of discourse that evolves within a branch of knowledge. As a result, the benchmark of intellectual progress can be effectively controlled through systematic, comprehensive, and sporadic mechanisms.

Artists and designers with an academic background have a full responsibility towards the development of the art and design world, both in terms of knowledge and artistic creations. The progress of scientific knowledge is demonstrated by the emergence of various new paradigms resulting from research, which are disseminated through various forms of scientific publications. This will showcase to society the power of academics in enlightening the nation through the knowledge of art and design. Academics also share the same responsibility in the realm of artistic creation, including aspects of visualization, technique, and hands-on skills in using artistic media. The created artworks should also be disseminated through other forms of scientific publications, such as exhibitions. Exhibitions and scientific journals should be regarded as two equivalent forms of scientific publications, serving as evidence of the novelty achieved by academics and as authenticity pursued for the sake of progress.

Uno Flatu is an effort to implement the above-mentioned principles, an exhibition that showcases visual artworks by academics, specifically the faculty members from the Faculty of Arts and Design at Maranatha Christian University (including artworks by faculty members from partner institutions both domestically and internationally). In line with its main concept, Uno Flatu is designed to demonstrate the outcomes of academic activities to the general public, particularly students, showcasing the

credibility and expertise of academics in their artistic endeavors, transforming ideas into expressive artworks and representing a refined sense of aesthetics.

Uno Flatu ('one breath') this time carries the theme "Respirare Iterum," which literally means "to breathe again," an idiom that carries conditional connotations. "To breathe again" signifies a condition where after a previous moment of not breathing or experiencing a "disturbance" in our breathing, we find it difficult to breathe freely. The post-Covid-19 pandemic era can be interpreted as a period that brings relief to the world, an era where we seemingly start breathing anew, adopting new habits, and even embracing a new life because globally we have gone through moments of "shortness of breath," struggling to breathe, and even not breathing. The renewed vitality and enthusiasm are embraced by the Uno Flatu 2023 Exhibition as a celebration of a spacious and liberated state, both physically and spiritually. The exhibition attempts to present the spirit that rises from adversity in all aspects of life.

In addition, the content of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) is connected by the Uno Flatu exhibition as a contribution and responsibility towards the global condition of the continued existence of human life and the environment, which are increasingly vulnerable to damage on Planet Earth. In order to ensure sustainability in the future, each showcased artwork carries a conservative message and a sense of concern for the continuity and sustainability of life in the world, promoting peace and harmony. Therefore, every artwork strives to incorporate one of the 17 SDGs points as its underlying theme.

The artworks exhibited at Uno Flatu this time are also highly diverse. Some artworks follow a two-dimensional (2D) convention, such as paintings, drawings, photography, and digital prints. Meanwhile, three-dimensional (3D) artworks are presented in the form of various objects. In terms of techniques, media, and visualization, the presentations are also varied, with each artwork showcasing the artists' skill in manipulating techniques and media to convey their ideas related to the SDGs. This time, Uno Flatu is attended by more than 100 participants from 18 partner institutions spanning 7 countries, with over 100 artworks being exhibited.

Uno Flatu 2023, held in the Exhibition Hall of Building B on the first floor, is not only a biennial art and design exhibition but also a manifestation of the responsibility of academics (specifically faculty members) towards the development of discourse in the field of visual arts. It represents a commitment to the sustainability of human life and environmental harmony on Planet Earth. Furthermore, it aims to engage and embrace other art institutions and members of the academic community, encouraging them to continue expressing themselves, creating art, and "breathing again" in unison for the continuity and advancement of knowledge and innovation in the social field of visual arts and design as a whole.
