

# CHAPTER ONE

## INTRODUCTION

### **Background of the Study**

The Battle for Christabel is one of Margaret Forster’s novels. This novel brings the reality of life through its characters which are described like people in

reality. This novel tells about a woman named Rowena, who really wants a baby; yet, it is very unique because Rowena does not want the baby's father. Unfortunately, five years after the birth of Christabel, Rowena is tragically killed in a climbing accident. Now, it becomes an issue because there are two women struggling to get a right to take care of Rowena's daughter, Christabel. The two women are Mrs. Blake, Christabel's grandmother, and Isobel, Rowena's friend. Yet at the end of the story they have to accept their defeat. In The Battle for Christabel, the present writer finds that Forster succeeds in creating various characters and making an interesting story.

The present writer has decided to deal with the portrayal of the major characters because they have different characteristics which are interesting to analyse and the characters in the novel are lifelike because they represent people in our daily life. Through the characters, the readers can analyse and understand the story they read. The characters have an important role to help readers understand the whole purpose of the writing of the book. 'The contrast between the behaviour of each character is what makes theme come alive and enables the reader to believe in them. The characters react to each other and develop throughout a novel, and it is this action and reaction that usually makes up the majority of good book' (Reader and Woods, 1987:57).
