His step-father was a preacher. The relationship between James Baldwin and his step-father was not good. In Harlem, they lived in poverty. When Baldwin was 14 years old, he became a preacher for three years at the small Pentecostal church in Harlem.

He was an African-American novelist, writer, playwright, poet, essayist, and civil rights activist. He was known as an African-American writer of the twentieth century. Some of Baldwin's works describe some important issues in the mid-twentieth century, such as racism, social status, and political inequality. His works also explore questions of identity and psychological pressures that point to the black people and the homosexual.

Go Tell It on The Mountain was Baldwin's first novel. The novel was published in 1953. This novel was known as James Baldwin's autobiographical novel, as it represents Baldwin's young life and experience. John Grimes, the

protagonist of the novel, faces the harsh treatment of his step-father. This kind of treatment also happened to James Baldwin when he lived with his stepfather.

Giovani's Room is his second novel, published in 1956.
