BIOGRAPHY OF CORMAC MCCARTHY

Cormac McCarthy is an American novelist. He was born in July 20, 1933, Providence, Rhode Island. Now, he is 76 years old. He is a novelist and a playwright. He was raised in Knoxville, attending the University of Tennessee, then he joined the Air Force and he was serving two of four years in Alaska. In mid 1960s, he traveled through United Kingdom, Southern Europe, and then he returned to Tennessee. After his divorce, he moved to El Paso in 1976. After a few years, he married to Jennifer Winkley and decided to move North of Santa Fe with their son, John McCarthy.

He wrote many notable works such as <u>Blood Meridian</u>, <u>The Evening Pedness in the West</u>, <u>The Border Trilogy</u>, <u>No Country for Old Men</u> and his last work, <u>The Road</u>. McCarthy has also written many plays and screen plays. His earlier work, <u>Blood Meridian</u> in 1985 is placed as number three in the 2006 Time Magazine's list of the greatest American novel of the previous 25 years and is also placed among the 100 best English language books. For the same title taken by The New York Times as the second best book from 125 authors, publishers and editors of the best book. <u>Blood Meridian</u> was adapted a 2007 film, which won four academic awards, including for the best picture. His last novel, <u>The Road</u> was

awarded the Pulitzer Prize for fiction, the 2006 James Trait Black Memorial Prize for fiction, was chosen as one of Oprah's book selections and was a finalist for the 2006 National Book Critics Circle Award for fiction. He dedicated <u>The Road</u> to his son, John McCarthy. Many critics state that this book may be the most important environmental book ever.

A literary critic, Harold Bloom named McCarthy as one of the four major American novelists of his time, along with Thomas Pynchon, Don Delilo, and Philiph Roth. He is frequently compared by modern reviewers to William Faulkner and sometimes to Herman Melville.
