CONCLUSION

After completing the analysis of the protagonist in <u>The Road</u> by Cormac McCarthy, I would like to draw a conclusion. <u>The Road</u> is set in a post apocalyptic situation, in which people have to struggle hard to survive. In my opinion, it is a lot more difficult when we are put in a horrible situation, because not only that we have to struggle for ourselves, but we also have to save the ones we love. In the novel, I believe that the success of the father in saving his young son is supported by all of his characteristics. Road is suitable in representing love and affection to the beloved ones because the novel clearly describes the struggle of the father to defend his son's life.
