BIOGRAPHY OF PAULO COELHO

Paulo Coelho was born in August 24, 1947 in the city of Rio de Janeiro. Before dedicating his life completely to literature, he worked as theatre director and actor, lyricist and journalist. In 1982 Coelho published his first book, <u>Hell Archives</u>, and then in 1985 he contributed to the <u>Practical Manual of Vampirism</u>. In 1986, Paulo Coelho did the pilgrimage to Saint James of Compostella, an experience later to be documented in his book <u>The Pilgrimage</u> (1987). In the following year, Coelho published <u>The Alchemist</u>, which became one of the best selling Brazilian books of all time. In October 2008, he entered for the Guinness Book of Records with his book <u>The Alchemist</u>, as the most translated book in the world. His books are numerous.
