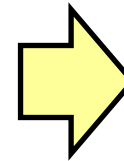

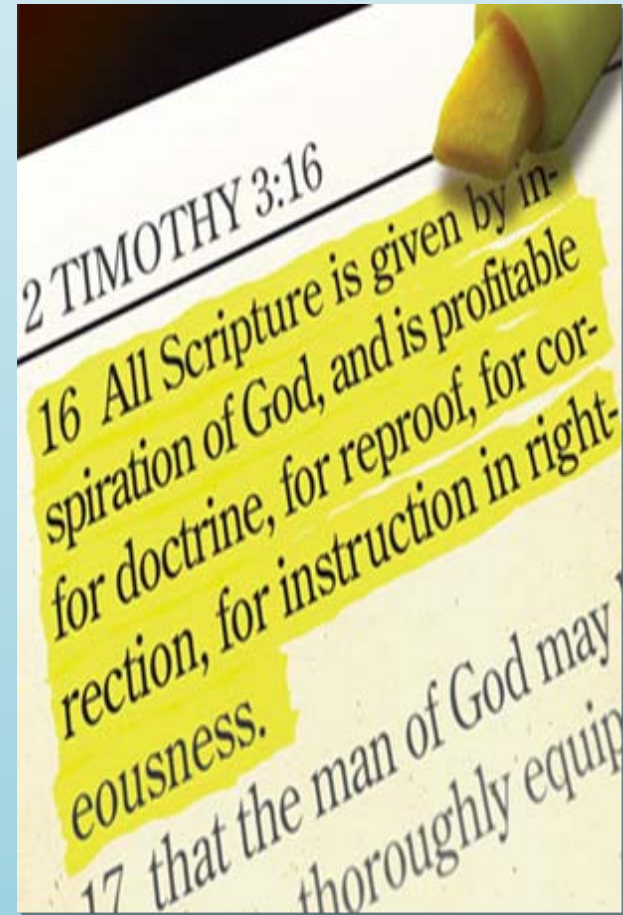

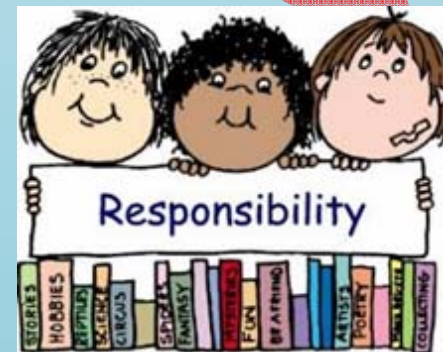


Important Points in Delivering Christian Values

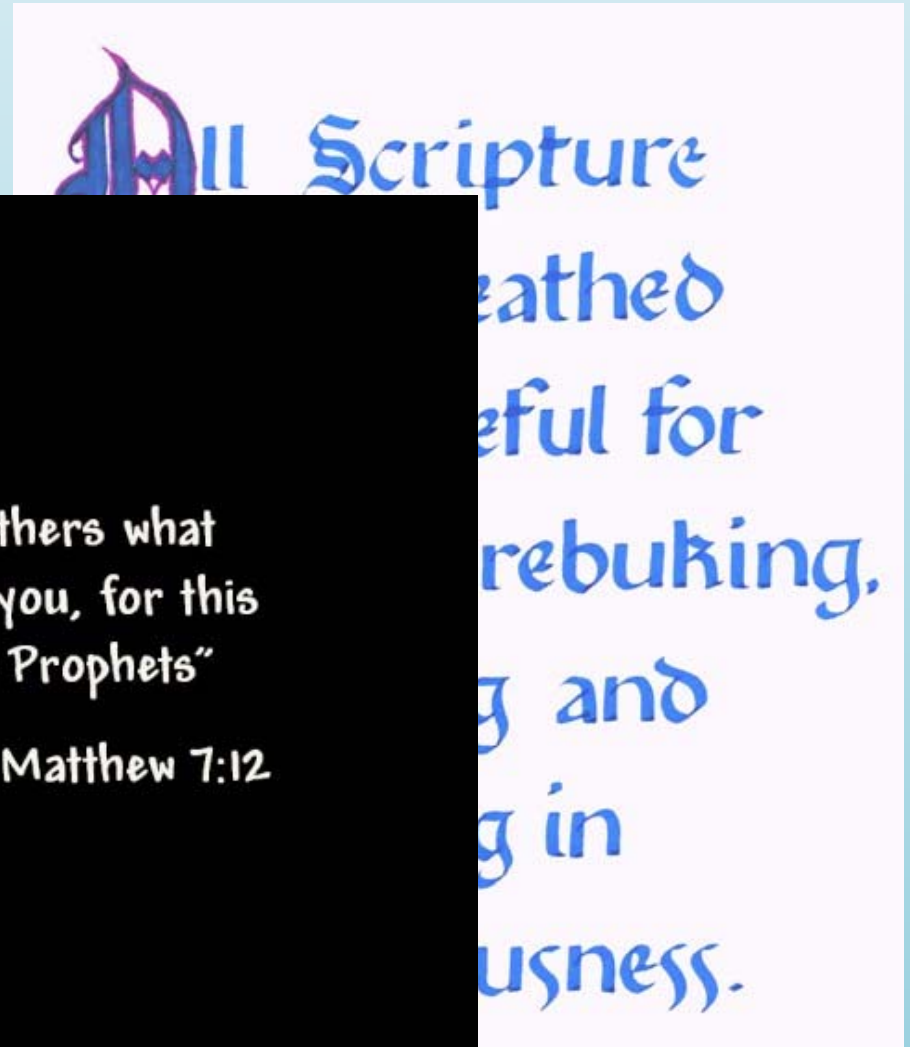
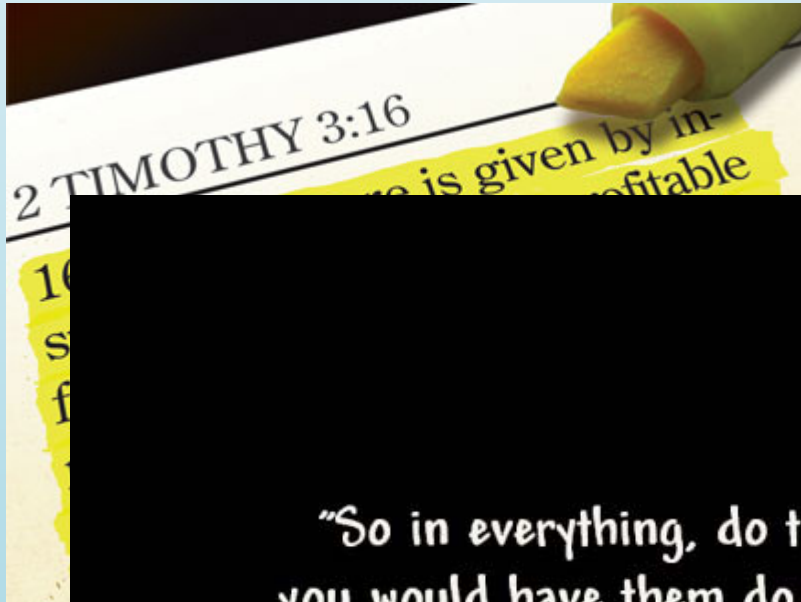
